**Biodiversity Duty:
Vascular Plant Survey of National Museum Wales,
Cathays Park, Cardiff**

Introduction

From 1 October 2006, all public authorities in England and Wales have a duty to have regard to the conservation of biodiversity in exercising their functions (Section 40 of the Natural Environment and Rural Communities Act 2006). As part of the Museum's response to this legislation, biodiversity audits are being carried out at a series of its sites. In this report, a vascular plant list is presented from a survey of the grounds of the National Museum Cardiff in Spring and early Summer 2008.

Methods

Surveys were carried out on 10 April, 8 May, 14 May, 4 June and 3 July 2008 coupled with a few records noted whilst coming to and from work. In 2009 surveys were carried out on 19 March, 8 April, and regularly in May to sample dandelions.

The area surveyed is shown in Figure 1. No surveys were carried out on the roof of the building as this has been recently replaced. Surveys were carried out by walking around the grounds. A few specimens of taxa difficult to identify were collected for later determination. Obviously planted taxa such as the Ginkgo trees were not recorded. Nomenclature follows C.A. Stace (1997), *New Flora of the British Isles*, Cambridge University Press.

Results

The species recorded are listed in Table 1. The species list for the grasslands are likely to be incomplete due to regular mowing which makes vegetative grass identification difficult.

<i>Ranunculus acris</i>	Meadow buttercup	Rare, weed in new grass on east side and on grass near toilet

<i>Ranunculus ficaria</i> subsp. <i>ficaria</i>	Lesser Celandine	Rare, in grassland around museum and gutters of car park

Discussion

A total of 108 species have been recorded to June 2009 recorded, of which 16 were not native to the British Isles. Most of the plants are common and widespread and of little interest, but two are worthy of note:

1. *Catapodium rigidum* subsp. *majus* is a rare grass which has been persistent, despite herbicide treatment, on the cobbles above the west side of the lower car park since at least 1997 (Figure 2).
2. *Erophila glabrescens*; a locally distributed species once abundant on the cobbles outside the Reardon Smith and probably introduced with them in c. 2000, but recently much reduced in quantity following the extensive roof works in 2007-8 (Figure 3). It is also regularly sprayed with herbicide as part of the grounds maintenance.

The most interesting area is the unimproved grassland along the west side of the building (see Phase 1 habitat survey report).
