- acquire objects and artworks which help us to tell the story of Wales and its people

Through our seven museums across Wales we work to enthuse people to discover, enjoy and learn bilingually, as well as supporting special exhibitions and delivering innovative learning, research and conservation programmes.

A legacy will perpetuate your support for ever, without incurring any tax. It might even help your family by reducing any Inheritance Tax Bills that might arise when you have gone. With a legacy you can help the charity you have loved during your lifetime, rather than allowing your savings to go to the state

Making a will is the only way to ensure that those you care about are provided for when you have gone.

First of all, you must make sure that your family and friends will receive what you want them to. You might then consider leaving a portion of your estate to help us to preserve our national heritage for the future. Very often during our lives, we can't be as generous as we want towards our favourite charities because of financial constraints, or because money is tied up in our homes. Your solicitor will explain how to include a bequest in your will.

Please tell us whether you have included, or intend to include, Amgueddfa Cymru in your will. This helps us both with long-term planning, and to evaluate how successful our marketing has been. We desperately need more people to support us in this way – you can help by telling us that you have pledged your support.



Many people who pledge support to us enjoy the opportunity for an exclusive visit to the museums, to meet the curators and see behind the scenes of their favourite parts of the collections.

If you have included us in your will and would like to see first-hand how we work 'backstage', please contact the Development Department to arrange a visit (contact details are on the pledge form).

When you have remembered your family and friends in your will, please consider leaving the residue of your estate, or a percentage of it, to Amgueddfa Cymru.

Your solicitor will explain how to include a bequest in your Will, which is easy and tax effective. Please arrange to see your solicitor so that a gift to the Museum can be included (you may wish to give this leaflet to your solicitor so that she/he can use the suggested phrases attached).

Types of Gifts

Pecuniary legacy or bequest:

A gift where you specify the amount to be given.

Residuary legacy or bequest:

A gift of the residue of the estate, or a percentage of it. The residue is the amount that is left over after the distribution of all other payments, for example to friends and family.

Specific legacy or bequest:

Where a particular item of property is specified in a will, for example, a work of art, furniture or shares.

Reversionary legacy or bequest:

Where the benefit of your estate remains with a named person during their lifetime, then on their death is given to the charity.

Remember, your will is the best way of providing for those who are important to you and to help Amgueddfa Cymru preserve the heritage of Wales.

How to make a pledge

Talk to your solicitor

Your solicitor might find it useful to have the following words, either as part of a new will or as a Codicil to an existing one.

I give to Amgueddfa Cymru – National Museum Wales, Cathays Park, Cardiff, CF10 3NP, Registered Charity Number 525774, either:

A a percentage (please specify) of the residue of my estate for its general purposes, or
B the sum of £ for its general purposes.
If you own an item you believe is of national importance, you may wish to leave it to Amgueddfa Cymru as a direct bequest. This can be tax effective too, but please check with the Development Department when you draw up your will so we can make sure we will be able to accept your item and look after it as you would wish
