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What are they?



Our virtual sessions are a great way of 'visiting' the museum if you can't see us in person, or to support pupils' learning before and after a trip to one of our sites!



Our virtual sessions are all designed to last between 45 minutes to 1 hour. The main portion of the session will be led by one of our facilitators, who will talk about your chosen topic with objects from our collections to support learning.



The session also includes time for questions from pupils. As the sessions are quite interactive, we recommend one class per slot.



We currently have 17 different sessions to choose from - ranging from Explore Art, to Roman Bootcamp, to The 1960s!

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Getting ready



Set up your camera & classroom so all the pupils in the class can be seen. Museum staff need to see how pupils are reacting or if they are raising their hands to ask questions.



Set up your microphone so pupils can be heard to ask questions. If pupils need to step forward to ask questions, please prepare them for this. If pupils cannot be heard by Museum staff, we ask that the teacher ask questions on the pupils' behalf.

While our facilitators lead the sessions, teachers are still required to be present to supervise the class, field questions, and work with us to resolve any technical issues.



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Quick Tips





Can you hear us?

Check which speaker is selected in the Mic settings during the call - there can be multiple options!


If you want to use the computer's speakers, click the 'Speakers' option. If you want to use external speakers that you have plugged in, find their name in the list and select those. They are usually recognisable by brand name.

Can we hear you?


Check which microphone is selected in the Mic settings during the call. Like the speakers, check if you are using the built-in option, or an external mic.

Can we see you?

Make sure your camera is on by checking the Camera settings in the call. If it has a line through it, click the camera icon to switch it on. If you are using an external camera, click the arrow next to the camera icon and select the camera you want to use.



If you're still having trouble, check that your computer doesn't have a built-in camera cover that slides over the lens!
