Llwybr 1 Olwyn Ddŵr a Llofft Batrwm

Ewch am dro bach i fyny'r grisiau i weld yr olwyn ddŵr anferthol. Oeddech chi'n gwybod mai dyma'r olwyn ddŵr fwyaf ar dir mawr Prydain? Roedd yn arfer pweru holl offer y gweithdai peirianeg! Dringwch y grisiau sy'n arwain at yr olwyn ddŵr, a rhyfeddwch at ei maint a'i phŵer.

Ewch ar antur arall gan droi i'r dde ar waelod yr olwyn ddŵr, ac anelu at y ffowndri. Ewch i fyny grisiau llofft batrwm lle gwelwch chi dros 2,000 o batrymau pren manwl yn ein casgliadau.



TRAIL 1 Waterwheel & Pattern Loft

For a quick hit that involves stairs on your step count – head for the enormous waterwheel.

Did you know that it's the largest on mainland Britain and once powered all the machinery used in the engineering workshops? Climb the steps up to the waterwheel and marvel at its size and power!

For another steps adventure turn right at the bottom of the waterwheel and head for the foundry. Head up the stairs up to the pattern loft where you'll see over 2,000 intricate wooden patterns in our collections.

Llwybr 2 Tai'r Chwarelwyr

Os hoffech fynd yn ôl mewn amser, ewch draw i dai'r chwarelwyr! Mae tŷ 1861 yn Nhanygrisiau ar anterth y diwydiant Llechi, 1901 yn Bethesda yng nghyfnod Streic y Penrhyn a tŷ 1969 yn Llanberis, sydd wedi'i ddodrefnu fel y byddai wedi edrych pan gaeodd Chwarel Dinorwig yn haf 1969.

TRAIL 2 Quarrymen's Houses

Head to the quarrymen's houses and enjoy a bit of time-travelling! Visit the 1861 house in Tanygrisiau at the height of the slate industry, 1901 in Bethesda at the time of the Penrhyn Lockout and 1969 in Llanberis – furnished as it would have been when the Dinorwig Quarry closed in the summer of 1969.

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
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Llwybr 3 Yr Amgueddfa Gyfan

TRAIL 5

Dolbadarn Castle and Llanberis village

This walk takes you past Dolbadarn Castle and to Llanberis village. Leave the museum via the main archway and head for the pavement taking you out of the park. Turn right over the footbridge (by the quarrymen's houses) onto the field. You can take a left and visit Dolbadarn Castle here or head onwards to enjoy the shops and attractions of the village. Please follow the public pathways!

TRAIL 6

Quarry Paths

If you're feeling adventurous why not follow one of the park walks?

There are a few to follow including the Circular Lake Walk, the Woodland Walk or the Vivian Trail which takes you towards the Quarry lookout point for the most stunning views of the slate galleries and local scenery.*
