

This symbol shows when a place is noisy.




This symbol shows when a place has a change in lighting.



If you arrive by coach

Our FREE coach / mini bus parking can be found opposite the main reception.



Entrance to Reception

On arrival at Big Pit head into the main reception building.







Reception Area

Here our friendly staff will show you where to go.

Your group leader will be sent your visit itinerary ahead of the day.







Getting to the Waiting Room

The waiting room is accessed via a set of stairs from inside this building or via the ramp outside.







Waiting Room for Underground Tour

The waiting area for the underground tour can sometimes be very busy.

You will be met here by one of our Miner Guides who will lead you on your underground tour.



'Kitting Up'

Here, one of our Miner Guides will fit you with your safety equipment to go underground.

- A safety helmet with light attached (adjusted and fitted)
- A belt, worn around the waist, with a battery pack and self-rescuer

These items can feel a little heavy, your miner guide will make sure you are comfortable.









Lockers for 'contraband'

Many items are not able to be taken underground for safety reasons. We call these 'contraband'.

These include:


- watches
- mobile phones
- cameras
- cigarettes
- matches/lighters
- e-cigarette



The Cage to go Undergound

One of our Miner Guides will take 15 people underground at a time.

The cage travels at around 2 metres a second and taken 90 seconds to reach Pit Bottom, 90m below the surface.









Underground Tour

Once you arrive at Pit Bottom your Miner Guide will guide you on captivating journey around a section of original underground workings. The tour lasts 45-60 minutes.

During the tour you will experience areas with lowered ceilings and low lighting. You will hear the sound of the bell and the underground communication system.

During your tour the Miner Guide will also provide an opportunity to experience the total darkness of underground by asking you to turn your lamp off.

There is no obligation to go underground. Once underground you must stay with your group and guide until the end of your tour.









Tram Route

Once you arrive back on the surface, you can make your way around the tram route leading to the Lamp Room.

The ground in this area is rough and uneven.



Lamp Room

This is where all the lamps used onsite are checked and recharged.

You will return you lamps here after your tour.



Canaries

Canaries are kept in the Lamp Room as a reminder of the canaries that were once used underground to detect dangerous gases or 'damp'.






Winding House

In this building you'll be able to watch the driver operate the Winding Engine, bringing the cages up and down the shaft.

The sound of the electric engine can be heard in this area.







Colliery Workshops

In this area you can explore Big Pit's Blacksmith Forge and Surface Stables.

Inside the forge a video of Big Pit's blacksmith working can be seen and heard.









Slope to King Coal and the Pithead Baths

The ramped walkway will take you to our 'King Coal: The Mining Experience' and the Pithead Baths.



King Coal: The Mining Experience


King Coal is an audio-visual tour through a simulated coal mine.

The tour lasts approximately 25 minutes. You are able to leave if you need to.

Flashing lights and 2 loud explosive sounds will be heard in this area.

King Coal can be done as well as, or instead of, an underground tour, or not at all.







Entrance to Pithead Baths

Miners' Lockers

The original 'dirty' lockers for Big Pit's Miners can be found here.

Some of the lockers have been made into display cases.

Please note that the sound of recorded voices talking and singing at a moderate volume can be found in this area.

Exhibtions

Throughout the Pithead Baths you will find exhibitions that tell the story of Welsh coal and the people that mined it.

In the cottage area explore the inside and outside of a miners cottage, crawl through a 'heading' and discover more about the society created by coal.

You will see and hear some audio-visual displays throughout this area, as well as some interactive exhibitions.





Exhibition Exit

You can exit the exhibitions at the end of the galleries, where you'll also find the Miners' Canteen.



Route to Site Exit

To exit the site, make your way to the building where the Reception and Gift Shop are found at the lowest level of the site. These can be accessed via the steps to the left or ramp to the right.

- Local food, ales and spirits





Our original Miners' Canteen can be found in the Pithead Baths building on the highest level of the site. The Canteen serves a small range of hot and cold drinks, cakes and snacks.
