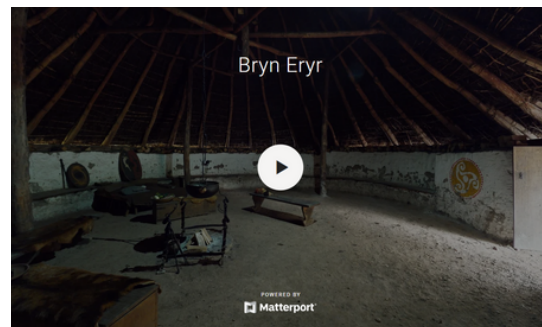
## Bryn Eryr Virtual Visit:

We have created a virtual visit to Bryn Eryr - St Fagans' Iron Age Farmstead. Please watch this film with your class before your digital workshop. →



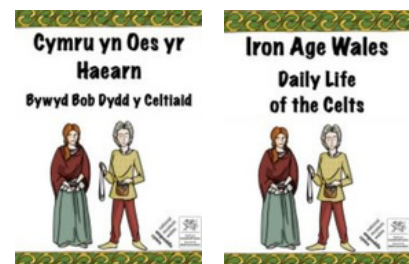
## Explore Bryn Eryr in 360°
