

We are a charity made up of 7 museums and 1 collection centre. You can visit our museums for free, and everyone is welcome.



Just under 1 and a half million visitors came to visit us from April 2024 to March 2025.



Almost 2 and a half million people visited our website. About the same amount follow us on social media.



754 volunteers worked for us.

Digital means using things like computers, the internet, tablets, and smartphones.



We want to be a place for everyone, now and in the future.



We want to work well with other organisations and communities.



We want to support our staff and treat people equally and fairly.



This document is about our work towards our 6 commitments in 2024 to 2025.

1. Make sure our work includes everyone



We have worked more with communities. This has helped more people be included.



It has also helped more people tell us about their experiences. People's stories can be included in our work.



We have run projects like **Something New** (**Newid Byd**) with **Innovate Trust** and **purpleSTARS**. This has meant people with learning disabilities take part.





We also worked with groups in the south Wales valleys to make **Streic! 84-85 Strike** and **The Valleys** exhibitions.



We have had other projects where people can get involved. For example, **Black History 365**, St Fagans National Museum of History and **Wales is...Proud**.



Also, our events at Pride Cymru, Urdd Eisteddfod, Royal Welsh Show, Craft Festival Wales.



2. Help people be creative and learn at any age



We have given people the chance to get involved in our work and learn.



We have worked with organisations like:

- Flying Start
- Tŷ Hafan
- Mudiad Meithrin
- Welsh Refugee Council
- Art Fund and Nesta for the Mini Wonders programme



We have also offered people chances to learn online.



For example, through **Expanding Horizons**. This programme has helped school children learn about our collections.

There have also been chances to learn skills. For example, through:

Mechanics at the National Slate Museum.

 Skills Development Placements at National Museum Cardiff.



We would like to thank our amazing volunteers. Their time and passion are so important to our work.

3. Look after nature and our environment



We are working hard to look after the environment. And make sure our work causes less damage.



We have made changes to how we use energy, like heating and electricity.



We have improved how we recycle and reduce waste.





We have planted more wildflowers at National Museum Cardiff. And hay meadows at St Fagans National Museum of History.



We have a **Meadow Trail** at the National Wool Museum.



We are also learning more about the planet from working with students and others, carrying out research.



4. Support people's well-being



We are working on our museums and programmes to help improve well-being for all.



A lot of work is happening to improve the National Slate Museum.



There was a programme called **Farewell... For Now** in November. This helped bring together people's experiences and memories before the improvements are made.







There is a **Weaving Shed** at the National Wool Museum. This has been restored.



The Vulcan Hotel opened at St Fagans National Museum of History.



Our projects try and put well-being first. For example, our **Museums Inspiring Memories** programme.

5. Do more things digitally




We are doing more work online to help people be more involved.



Thousands of artworks are available to see online at the website <u>Celf ar y Cyd</u>.



We have a new What's On page that makes it easier to plan a visit.





We are also using technology to help people learn. For example, with our **Mammoth** at National Museum Cardiff. This uses a type of technology called **augmented reality**.



Another example of technology is through the National Roman Legion Museum. We are using an app called TellMe.



Here people can experience the museum online. This is called **virtual reality**.



6. Work with others around the world



We worked with an art museum in Paris called Musee d'Orsay.



They loaned us a painting by the artist Vincent Van Gogh. This is the first time a self-portrait by this artist has been displayed in Wales.



We also worked with an art museum in Japan.



More museums around the world are interested in working with us.



St Fagans National Museum of History was used for the film called **Mr Burton and Death Valley**.

Other work we have done



We have worked hard to keep our museums safe and welcoming.



We improved our food and shopping services. We now run them ourselves.



We have kept growing our research and working with students through the **Honorary Research Fellow** scheme.



We are improving the use of the Welsh language. Making sure our learning materials can be used in Welsh.



We are also giving staff the chance to learn Welsh and British Sign Language.
