



2 x Creative Producer roles

St Fagans Food Festival is an annual 2-day family friendly event showcasing Welsh food and drink, sustainability and entertainment. This year's festival will be held on 12th and 13th September 2026.

Our Amgueddfa Cymru Producers (ACPs) have been curating the music for the festival since 2021. We have seen over 50 emerging Welsh artists and bands perform at the festival across a variety of locations.

We are offering **two Creative Producer roles** to support the design and delivery of a pop-up, unplugged, entertainment programme around the festival site. The ACPs will work with the Events team to host a collaborative programme of Welsh based musicians, performers and artists. This might include songs, spoken word, dance, theatrics etc.

Due to the nature of the outdoor event, we are looking to develop a flexible and responsive approach to the programme of entertainment. There will be scope to adapt elements of the programme on the day in discussion with the Events team responding to weather, audiences and site conditions. We are looking for a creative, eclectic and collaborative approach, balancing artistic experimentation with the practical considerations of working on a museum site during a busy event.

The Food Festival delivers a bilingual programme with a balance of Welsh and English language. The performances will also need to reflect this. One of these roles is Welsh Language essential.

What you'll be doing

- Working as a team and under the guidance of the wider Events team
- Attending and hosting regular meetings
- Bringing creatives together to collaborate in the delivery of pop-up performances
- Organising a workshop/collaborative session on site for the artists to develop performances
- Liaise with artists, contracts, site locations
- Develop performance schedules for the musical acts that align with the wider event programme
- Be on site for the festival weekend to support the delivery of the performances over the festival weekend. Experience is helpful but not essential.

We can offer flexible working arrangements, working with you to create a schedule that works around your availability and providing the opportunity to work from home. However, there are some non-negotiable dates leading up to and during the event when you will be required to be on site all day.

This opportunity requires you to travel to and work at St Fagans. We don't offer travel expenses to your main site of work. You can claim travel expenses when you work at any of our other museum sites or do fieldwork. If travel is a barrier to you applying, please let us know and we can discuss access requirements and make an adjustment.
