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About us

St Fagans: National History Museum is one of Europe's leading open-air museums. Over forty original re-erected historic buildings from all over Wales show how people in Wales lived and worked in the past.

Developing St Fagans for the future

We have received funding from the Heritage Lottery fund and Welsh Government to completely transform the visitor experience at St Fagans. Over the next four years developments will include a new entrance hall, learning facilities, new gallery spaces and historic buildings including a medieval Welsh prince's hall.

Booking and planning

Group visits must be booked in advance

Please note that certain buildings cannot be visited without advance booking, so let us know if there is a specific building that you want to visit. Also make sure that special activities are booked as early as possible to avoid disappointment, particularly during the period of redevelopment.

Health and safety information

The Museum will do everything possible to limit disruption to your visit during this time but please ensure that your group observes all additional safety signage on site. Eating arrangements

Twenty minute slots for lunch undercover can be allocated on arrival at the Museum. There are also outdoor picnic areas available. Take away lunch bags are available to order on (029) 2057 3414.

Museum shop

Teachers can pre-order souvenir bags suitable for children which can be collected and paid for on the day of the visit. To book bags, please phone (029) 2057 3412.

Charges for facilitated sessions

There is a charge for curriculum-focused sessions led by Museum staff. There are four different prices (excluding VAT):

for sessions of up to 1 hour
for up to 15 pupils - £27

for sessions of up to 1 hour
for up to 35 pupils - £42

for sessions of up to half a day
for up to 15 pupils - £47

for sessions of up to half a day
for up to 35 pupils - £77

If your school is in Wales and is recognised by the government as having more than 20% of pupils in receipt of free school meals, according to the latest figures, there will be no charge for sessions. Special Educational Needs and Pupil Referral Unit groups are also eligible for free sessions.

Your school will be sent an invoice after the date of your visit. This must still be paid if you cancel later than 10am the day before or are late on the day and miss your session. Prices exclude VAT but most schools can claim this back.

A visit to the Museum can include as many of the following activities as you have time for. Mix and match with our facilitated sessions for a specific curriculum focus.

- dig deeper into life in Wales with a visit to the reconstructed buildings and historical gardens

- explore St Fagans Castle and impressive formal gardens
- discover the wildlife that inhabits this large, open air site and visit the Bird Hide for a peek at our feathered friends

Sessions available for Foundation Phase and KS2

Gwalia Stores

Meet the shopkeeper in Gwalia Stores, to see what shopping was like over 80 years ago.

Toys

Compare and contrast how children have played through the ages, and test your skills on traditional toys.

Washday with Beti Bwt

Experience washing before the advent of the washing machine.

Meet the Trees

Explore the forest through sight, sound, touch and smell and make a work of art using the natural materials provided by the woods.

All the sessions above last 1 hour and are led by Museum staff.

The cost per session is £27 for up to 15 pupils, £42 for up to 35.

Max. 30 pupils per session.

Rhyd-y-car

Visit the row of houses from Merthyr Tydfil and explore the differences between ways of life from 1805 to 1985.

30 minutes activity. Free of charge as this is a teacher-led session.

Craft Demonstrations

Book to see the blacksmith, miller, weaver or clogmaker demonstrate their traditional crafts, subject to availability.

Up to 30 minutes. Free of charge as available for all visitors.

History

Iron Age Celts

Help Build Our New Farmstead – Bryn Eryr

Create your own Celtic tribe and help us to complete the new Iron Age Farmstead. Learn about Iron Age life and try out a craft or survival skill.

Tudor Costume

Compare and contrast the clothes of the gentry with those of wealthy farmers, as modelled by four classmates. Discover hidden clues in a portrait of Tudor children at St Fagan's Castle (1580).

1 hour activity, led by Museum staff. £27 for up to 15 pupils, £42 for up to 35

Tudor Trail

Compare two Tudor houses, handle replica Tudor objects and visit St Teilo's Church (1530).

1½ hour activity. Free of charge as this is a teacher-led session but teachers must first attend the training day.

for KS2 teachers

Science and Sustainability
